Make a difference and have a voice on campus! Gain leadership and professional experiences. Network with campus administrators and other student organizational leaders. Be an advocate in representing student concerns on college committees, as well as, local and state-wide legislative bodies. The following are open positions on campus:

Executive Officers

Vice President of Judicial Affairs: The Vice President of Judicial Affairs shall be responsible for heading the Judiciary Committee. He/she shall be responsible for the President's duties if the President and Executive Vice President are unavailable or if these offices are vacant. He/she shall be responsible for all aspects of shared governance as it relates to ASMC, and shall perform other tasks as designated by either the President or the Council.

Treasurer: The Treasurer shall be responsible for the duties of the President and both Vice Presidents in the absence of the President or should both offices be vacant; shall oversee the accounting and disposition of ASMC funds; shall advise the President and the Council on all matters of finance and financial administration; shall provide a report of the Council's financial transactions at council meetings; shall prepare and issue the Council's membership financial reports on an as-requested basis; shall serve as the ASMC representative to the Committee on Budget Review and Recommendations; shall chair the Finance Committee; and shall perform other tasks as assigned by either the President or the Council.

Legislative Officers

Senators: Six (6) Area Senators, including one Area Senator representing the Los Banos Campus shall represent ASMC at large; shall be responsible for presenting student concerns to the Council; matters pertaining to publicity, coordination of events, and promotion of student involvement in ASMC; and all shall fulfill other tasks as assigned by the President or the Council. All are required to be on one shared governance committee and one ASMC Committee. The senator representing the Los Banos Campus must either reside in Los Banos or be enrolled in at least one (1) credit course located at the Los Banos Campus. (Descriptions on next page)



Vacant Position Descriptions

Senators:

Area 1: Science, Mathematics, and Engineering. Includes: Biology, Chemistry, Earth/Physical Science, Engineering, Math, and Physics.

Area 2 & 6 : English, Humanities, Economic & Workforce Development, Community Services, and Non-Credit Programs. Area 2 Include: Child Development, Communication Studies, English, Foreign Languages, Humanities, Philosophy, Cooperative Education, and Honors Programs. Area 6 Includes: Non-Credit Programs (continuing education), Business, Industry & Community Service, Workplace Learning Resource Center, Center for International Trade and Development, Child Development Center.

Area 3: Agriculture, Industrial Technology, Kinesiology, Health and Physical Fitness. Includes: Agriculture Business, Animal Science, Crop Science, Diesel Equipment Technology, Horseshoeing, Horse Management, Landscape Horticulture, and Mechanized Agriculture

Area 4: Allied Health, Business, and Public Safety. Includes: Diagnostic Radiologic Technology, Diagnostic Medical Sonography, Nurse Assistant, Registered Nursing, Vocational Nursing, Accounting, Administrative Office Management, Business, Computer Studies, Entrepreneurship, Food and Nutrition, Management, Marketing, Real Estate, Virtual Office Professional, Corrections, Criminal Justice, Emergency Medical Care, and Fire Technology.

Area 5: Visual Art, Photography, Digital Media, Theatre, Music, Anthropology & Archaeology, Child Development, Economics, Geography, History, Human Services, Liberal Studies, Political Science, Psychology, Sociology & Social Sciences

Area 7: Los Banos Campus.
